ELIGIBILITY

- **All Agriculture Departments in the Southwest Missouri District are eligible provided all teacher dues and fees are paid by February 27, 2026.**
- Any regularly enrolled agriculture student and active FFA member who have not judged in the specific contest at the state or national contest level.
- Students who qualified for state in a specific contest in previous years and whose team withdrew from the specific state contest AFTER that year's contest results were submitted by the district to the state, lose their eligibility to compete at district or state in that particular CDE in all following years.

TEAM

- May consist of three or four students, but only the high three scores count in the scoring. Unless the State CDE/LDE Handbook allows for more contestants.

- All entries for CDE's and LDE's will be on judgingcard.com and must be completed by 11:00 p.m. CST, March 13, 2026.

OFFICIAL FFA DRESS

- State CDE/LDE handbook guidelines will be used. All decisions regarding official dress will be made by the teacher committee. If a violation of official dress is found a 10% deduction will take place.

AREA MVATA PRESIDENTS

- The President of each of the Areas must submit all the Leadership Development Event Results for those teams and individuals qualifying for Districts to Mr. Jim Spencer Jr. 24 hours after Area LDE.

SPECIAL NOTES

- Due to Construction on the MSU Campus parking maps along with car, van & bus parking passes will be emailed to all schools entered before the contest.
- State CDE/LDE Handbook will be followed in conducting these events.
- Ties will be broken according to the State CDE/LDE Handbook.
- Committee members are responsible for participating in their assigned contests.
- The Contest Chairperson should contact the Superintendent in advance.
- Any contest requiring a calculator will use the guidelines in the State CDE/LDE handbook.
- High school students as guests of Missouri State University should be informed that it is a campus where they may observe the right of freedom of speech being demonstrated.
- The only card issues which will be addressed are those in which the judge(s) are responsible for such as reasons scores.
- No decisions on contest protests will be settled until the contest committee meets each evening after the days CDE's are over.

AWARDS

- Missouri State University will give the following awards:
 - Plaques will be awarded to the first, second, and third place teams.
 - Medals will be given to the top ten individuals in each contest.
 - Plaques and medals will be provided by the Missouri State University College of Agriculture with funds from the estate of Dr. & Mrs. Glenn E. Karls.
- To the first, second and third place winners in Public Speaking, Creed Speaking, and the Extemporeous Speaking contest, a gold, silver, and bronze medal will be awarded.

RESULTS

- Unofficial results will be posted as the contest is graded and tabulated. The results will become official at noon the day following the contest, provided no errors in tabulations are discovered. This method is being adopted in hopes of getting the results out to the students and teachers as soon as possible after the contest is over. Results can be accessed at judgingcard.com
- All results will be posted after grading, tabulated & reviewed by CDE committee member/District Supervisor before posting

COOPERATION

- It would be impossible to hold a contest for so many students without the fine cooperation of all the agriculture instructors, the district supervisors of agriculture, the producers of the community, the Missouri State University agriculture students, agricultural companies, and others. We appreciate this fine spirit and the ability to work together.

SPECIAL CONTEST REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE SW MISSOURI AGRICULTURE TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION

- **A SCHOOL SHALL NOT BE CONSIDERED AN ACTIVE CHAPTER AND SHALL NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE IN THE SOUTHWEST MISSOURI DISTRICT CONTESTS AT MISSOURI STATE UNIVERSITY UNLESS THE DISTRICT AND STATE DUES FOR ALL AGRICULTURE TEACHERS HAVE BEEN PAID BY FEBRUARY 27, 2026.**
- District Dues are \$30 per teacher paid to Kelin Kruse
- MVATA Dues are \$230 paid to Pam Rowland
- District Grading fees are \$115 paid to Kelin Kruse
- Failure to pay these grading fees on time will result in ineligibility of students to participate.
- Instructors check to see that contestants are properly entered when the team starts judging. Do not wait until after papers are scored.
- Final placing must be in the final placing space if the remainder of the card is filled out. The high individual will be used to break any tie, if necessary. If a tie still exists, the scores of the second high individual will break the tie. In case of a tie for tenth high individual, additional medal(s) will be awarded.
- Only District CDE/LDE Contest Committee members and District Officers are allowed in the grading room. If there are any issues please contact a district officer or committee member.
- All questions regarding the contests should be directed to the superintendent, not Missouri State University students.
- Missouri State University Agriculture students will assist with grading papers of contests.
- No graded examination papers covering the subject matter and no placing cards or papers will be returned or released by the contest superintendent. None will be reviewed or re-scored by committee chairmen or members.
- Students from the same school may not sit beside each other during any written exam.
- Committee chairmen should contact Missouri State University personnel before the contest.
- Any withdrawals of entries for the state contest must be made official by contacting Jim Spencer Jr. by email: jim.spencer@dese.mo.gov before 11:00 a.m., April 2, 2026.
- **As the District CDE/LDE schedule does not match the State schedule the following policy will be in place.** When district CDE/LDE's are scheduled at the same time but are not scheduled at the same time at State, a student must select which event they will participate in on the district level. The student must have competed in the 2nd contest area (verified via judging card) during the current contest season. When the 2nd contest team advances to state, the student will be added and certified to State. **Notice must be given to District Supervisor via email prior to the start the specific District CDE events.**

Special Needs:

- Requests for reasonable accommodations and assistance will be submitted, by **12:00 PM**, to the District Supervisor by the **March 23, 2026, *If request are not received by the deadline Missouri FFA makes no guarantee that the accommodation can be provided.***
- If an accommodation is selected from the list below, the participant will be required to fill out the Reasonable ADA and/or Special Request for Accommodation form located on the DESE Ag Education website. Upon completion of the form, the District Supervisor or a Missouri FFA staff member will contact the participant to gather additional information and/or discuss the reasonable accommodation(s) or assistance being requested.

- PLEASE NOTE: The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) recognizes and requires the Missouri FFA Organization to provide accommodations in order for participation in events conducted by Missouri FFA. These medical conditions, diagnosed by a recognized medical professional, will impact a students' ability to participate in activities offered during this Missouri FFA event. These may or may not require someone to assist the participant during the event.
- At no time will a student participating in a Missouri FFA event be responsible for the care or observation of another student. If a student requires care or observation, an adult must register to attend with the student at their cost.
- Short-term, temporary conditions such as surgery recovery or injury recovery, i.e., limbs in a cast due to fractures, crutches, etc., are not covered by the Americans with Disabilities Act. Participants are responsible for all assistance and equipment necessary to participate in the activities during the Missouri FFA event, including but not limited to personal assistants, wheelchairs, crutches.
- Wheelchairs are NOT provided by Missouri FFA; however, the participant may bring their own or rent from a local medical supply store in the area.
